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1. Orientation:

Event Description:

Student orientation or new student orientation is a period at the start of an academic year at an institution where the students are inquisitive about the happening at the college and the working of various clubs and committees. Typically, the first-year students were led by fellow students from senior years over the course of the week through various events ranging from campus tours, games, competitions, and field trips. The questions from the crowd ranged from business ideas to the product fit to game ideas.

A speech from the Professor Manish Kumar Gupta and later the Dean R&D, Professor Sanjeev Gupta boosted the spirit of the students and they were all encouraged to follow their passion, hone their skills and network. Participating in various activities, keep learning in the money minded world were some of the key teachings by the Professors.

The Session was opened by President of SEC, Yash Mirani which was followed by Yatri Patel - informing them about the structure of SEC. Later, Jay Dev arbitrated the session sharing personal stories - encouraging them and answering the questions.

3. Session on Hackathon Awareness:

Event Description:

DCEI conducted an event on importance of investing time to do web and android development so that the students can understand the basic ethics and requirements of work life by engaging in software platforms and professional coding groups which would help them get a kick start once their professional life commences. Many students want to start development but they fail to get a correct starting point; hence this session was thought to be essential so that students could no longer have to face that problem.

As part of this session we had an audience of around 100 students. These students were the ones interested in engaging in development and wanted to explore more in that domain. As part of this session we had mentors who had been exposed to the development culture and we asked them to share their views and their experience so that all the new interested people can take most out of their mistakes. For this talk the mentors shared their experience of using the basic development version control Github as it was basic for all budding developers to know about it. The also shared their projects in Web development to give the students a feel of what they could accomplish by investing some efforts and time. Tips regarding the favourable sites to start learning and develop later on that was also shared during the tenure of this session.

In the end of this session we were glad that students could take away the main key points that they would be needing to become good developers. We also got an insight on the hardships and error points they could be conducting in their journey to become successful developers.
