Dr. Tathagata Bandyopadhyay

DIRECTOR GENERAL

Dr. Tathagata Bandyopadhyay earned his PhD, MSc and BSc degrees in Statistics from the University of Calcutta. Before joining Dhirubhai Ambani University - DAU (formerly DA-IICT), he held the position of Dean (Faculty) and Professor at the Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad. Dr. Bandyopadhyay has extensive teaching experience and has visited several universities, including the University of Nebraska, University of Connecticut, Michigan State University, Iowa State University, University of Georgia, University of Windsor (Canada), Umea University (Sweden) and National University of Singapore. He assumed the role of Distinguished Professor at DAU in December 2021.

Since 2009, Dr. Bandyopadhyay has been the editor of the Calcutta Statistical Association Bulletin. Additionally, he has contributed to the editorial boards of journals such as Sankhya, Journal of the Indian Society of Agricultural Statistics and the Journal of Agricultural, Biological and Environmental Statistics (a journal of the American Statistical Association).

Having authored over 70 research articles in premier national and international journals, Dr. Bandyopadhyay has significantly contributed to the field. In addition to his editorial responsibilities, he has supervised numerous PhD students and played a crucial role as a member of the PhD Dissertation Committee at the University of Calcutta and IIMA.



Dr. G. Venkatesh

DIRECTOR - SCHOOL OF TECHNOLOGY

Dr. G. Venkatesh's career spans academia, industry, entrepreneurship and public policy. An alumnus of IIT Madras and TIFR Mumbai, he served as a faculty member in the Department of Computer Science and Engineering at IIT Bombay for eight years, where his research focused on declarative languages and their application to embedded systems and later as Chair Professor in Electrical Engineering at IIT Madras, working on complex embedded systems.

He spent over two decades in industry as Chief Technology and Strategy Officer at Sasken Communication Technologies, where he led the company's technology vision and IP licensing business, generating cumulative licensing and royalty revenues exceeding USD 200 million and earning national innovation and technovation awards. His industry leadership reflects a strong ability to bridge advanced research with scalable commercial outcomes.

Dr. Venkatesh has also served as a visiting and adjunct faculty at IIM Bangalore for a decade, teaching technology management and the application of game theory to strategic thinking. He has co-founded ventures in education and fintech and played a key role in creating IIT Madras' online BSc degree in Programming and Data Science, where he teaches courses on computational thinking and data-driven business management.

Closely associated with IIT Madras' Centre for Technology and Policy, he works with state governments on policy initiatives in education, health and technology. A Fellow of the Indian National Academy of Engineers and IETE, Dr. Venkatesh has received several honours for linking academia and industry and continues to serve on numerous government, academic and industry boards, contributing to innovation, entrepreneurship and institutional development.

Channel of Correspondence

The Office of the Dean (Students) at DAU is responsible for student welfare, campus life, wellbeing and student support & resolution. To ensure smooth communication and a transparent support system, all students are required to follow the policies and communication protocols outlined below.

1. Communication & Correspondence Protocol

1.1 For Individual Students

Students must follow the official escalation path for any request, concern, or query:

- Step 1: Contact the Student Body Government (SBG).
- Step 2: If unresolved, escalate to your Faculty Coordinator / Mentor.
- Step 3: The Faculty Coordinator/Mentor will forward the matter to the Office of the Dean (Students) for review and action.

1.2 For Clubs, Committees & Student Bodies

All official communication, event proposals, approvals, reports, or requests must:

- Be routed through the Faculty Coordinator / Mentor,
- Carry the required approvals, and
- Be submitted to the Office of the Dean (Students).

1.3 Direct Communication with the Dean (Students)

- Students may approach the Dean directly only in urgent or exceptional situations, with valid justification.
- If an email thread is already ongoing, the communication may continue normally.

Campus Facilities

DAU provides a comprehensive range of academic, residential, technological, medical, and recreational facilities to support quality teaching and learning, research activities, and holistic student development. The campus infrastructure is systematically planned and continuously upgraded to ensure accessibility, safety, inclusivity and sustainability in alignment with institutional goals and national quality benchmarks.

Resource Centre

The Resource Centre (RC) functions as the central knowledge repository of the University and plays a pivotal role in supporting academic and research activities. The RC houses a well-balanced collection of print and electronic resources, including books, e-books, journals, databases, theses and audio-visual materials across disciplines such as ICT, sciences, humanities and social sciences.

The Centre provides access to web-enabled catalogues and electronic resources through dedicated terminals and campus-wide connectivity. Resource sharing through national consortia and inter-library loan mechanisms enhances the availability of scholarly material. The RC also supports language learning and disseminates information on higher education opportunities, skill development and certification programmes. Extended operational hours during semesters and examinations facilitate uninterrupted academic engagement by students.



Information Technology Infrastructure

DAU has established a robust and scalable IT infrastructure to support teaching, learning, research and administrative operations. The campus is fully networked with high-speed internet connectivity, campus-wide LAN and secure wireless access. Centralised data centres, server farms and virtualisation technologies ensure reliable digital services and optimal resource utilisation.

The University maintains enterprise-grade security systems, including firewalls and authentication mechanisms, to ensure safe and regulated internet access. A dedicated IT helpdesk, supported by trained technical personnel, provides timely assistance to students and faculty. The institution adopts green computing practices such as server consolidation, power management systems and virtualisation to promote energy efficiency and sustainability.



Computing & Research Support Facilities

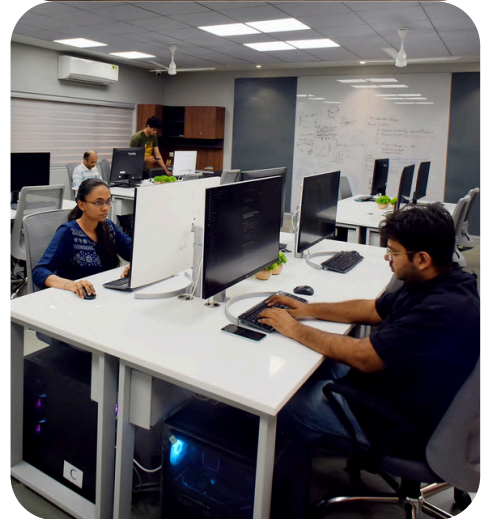
The University provides advanced computing infrastructure, including High Performance Computing (HPC) clusters and GPU-enabled servers, to support curriculum requirements and research activities. These facilities enable students and research scholars to undertake computationally intensive tasks in areas such as data analytics, artificial intelligence, modelling and simulation.

Dedicated computing resources are available for postgraduate and doctoral research, thereby strengthening the institution's research ecosystem and promoting interdisciplinary collaboration under faculty supervision.

Lecture & Laboratory Infrastructure

The Lecture Complex at DAU serves as a central academic facility equipped with modern audio-visual teaching aids, ergonomic seating and climate-controlled classrooms. The complex supports effective pedagogical delivery through lectures, seminars, workshops and academic events, contributing to an enhanced teaching–learning environment.

The Laboratory Complex comprises a wide range of discipline-specific teaching and research laboratories, including electronics, communication systems, VLSI, IoT, networking, computing, multimedia, artificial intelligence, signal processing and engineering design. The laboratories are equipped with advanced hardware, licensed and open-source software and relevant testing and measurement instruments. Extended access hours for selected laboratories facilitate academic work, research activities, workshops and technical events.



Residential Facilities (Halls of Residence)

DAU provides on-campus residential facilities through multiple Halls of Residence for men and women. The hostels are equipped with furnished rooms and essential amenities such as internet connectivity, hot water, laundry services, common areas and recreational facilities.

Special emphasis is placed on safety and security, particularly in women's hostels, through round-the-clock security personnel and regulated access systems. On-campus residence is compulsory for undergraduate students, while accommodation for postgraduate students is provided subject to availability. The residential system fosters a sense of community, discipline and peer learning among students.

Food Court & Cafeteria

The University has established multiple food courts across the campus to cater to the dietary needs of students. These facilities offer a variety of affordable, hygienic and nutritionally balanced food options, including vegetarian and non-vegetarian meals, regional cuisines, snacks and beverages.

Food courts are operated by experienced vendors and supported with adequate infrastructure to ensure quality, accessibility and convenience for the campus community.



Medical & Health Care Facilities

DAU provides on-campus medical support through a Medical Centre, offering primary healthcare services, free medical consultations and essential medicines during prescribed hours. The University has tie-ups with nearby multi-speciality hospitals to facilitate advanced medical care and emergency treatment.

A 24x7 in-campus ambulance facility is available to ensure prompt response during medical emergencies.

All students are covered under a Group Mediclaim Insurance Policy. Students can avail cashless treatment at empanelled hospitals. In cases where treatment is taken at non-empanelled hospitals, post-treatment reimbursement claims may be submitted to the University via email along with valid invoices and duly authorised supporting documents, as per the prescribed procedure.

These facilities ensure timely medical assistance, financial protection and student wellbeing on campus.



Campus Security & Safety Measures

The University ensures comprehensive campus security through trained security personnel deployed round the clock. Access control mechanisms and regular monitoring are implemented to maintain safety and discipline within the campus.

Security personnel are authorised to verify identification and coordinate with the University administration to address safety-related concerns. The institution enforces clear policies to ensure a secure and conducive environment for academic and residential activities.



Sports & Recreational Facilities

DAU recognises the importance of physical fitness and overall wellbeing in student development. The campus is equipped with extensive indoor and outdoor sports infrastructure, including basketball courts, football and cricket grounds, an athletic track, badminton courts, gymnasium, volleyball courts, table tennis facilities and designated spaces for yoga and meditation.

Structured coaching programmes and regular intra- and inter-university competitions encourage student participation, promote teamwork and leadership and contribute to the physical and mental wellbeing of students.

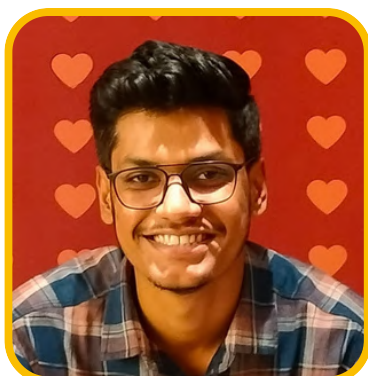

Cafeteria Management Committee (CMC)

Monitors hygiene, food quality and pricing, serving as a mediator between students, vendors and administration.

Cultural Committee

Organises cultural festivals, celebrations and talent showcases, maintaining the vibrancy of campus life.



Student Committees

Hostel Management Committee (HMC)

Ensures quality hostel life, addresses student grievances, manages resources and organises recreational facilities.

Tech-Support Committee

Provides ICT support (Wi-Fi, Moodle, Printing, Event Tech setups) and assists in the technical execution of events.

Sports Committee

Promotes fitness and competitive spirit; organises Concours (inter-university sports fest), DCL (cricket league) and inter-wing tournaments.

Student Placement Cell (SPC)

Facilitates placements by conducting pre-placement tests, mock interviews, alumni sessions and recruiter interactions.



How Clubs & Committees Function?

- Clubs and Committees are student-led bodies functioning under the guidance of the Dean (Students) and Faculty Mentors.
- Clubs organise co-curricular and extracurricular activities, while Committees support student welfare and campus governance.
- Members work together to plan events, represent student interests, and contribute to campus life.
- Active participation helps students develop leadership, teamwork, and organisational skills while serving the DAU community.

How to Become a Member?

- Participate in Club activities and events to become a Club Member and explore your interests.
- Students who wish to take up leadership and organisational responsibilities may apply to become Club Core Members when applications are announced.
- Join Student Committees by contesting elections or applying through the prescribed selection process, as applicable.
- Elections are generally held once every academic year, with additional selections or by-elections conducted to fill vacancies, if required.
- Students must meet the prescribed eligibility criteria, including satisfactory academic standing and a good disciplinary record, to be eligible for Committee membership.

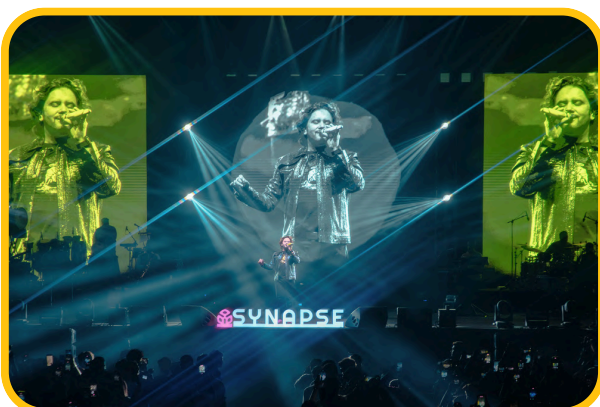

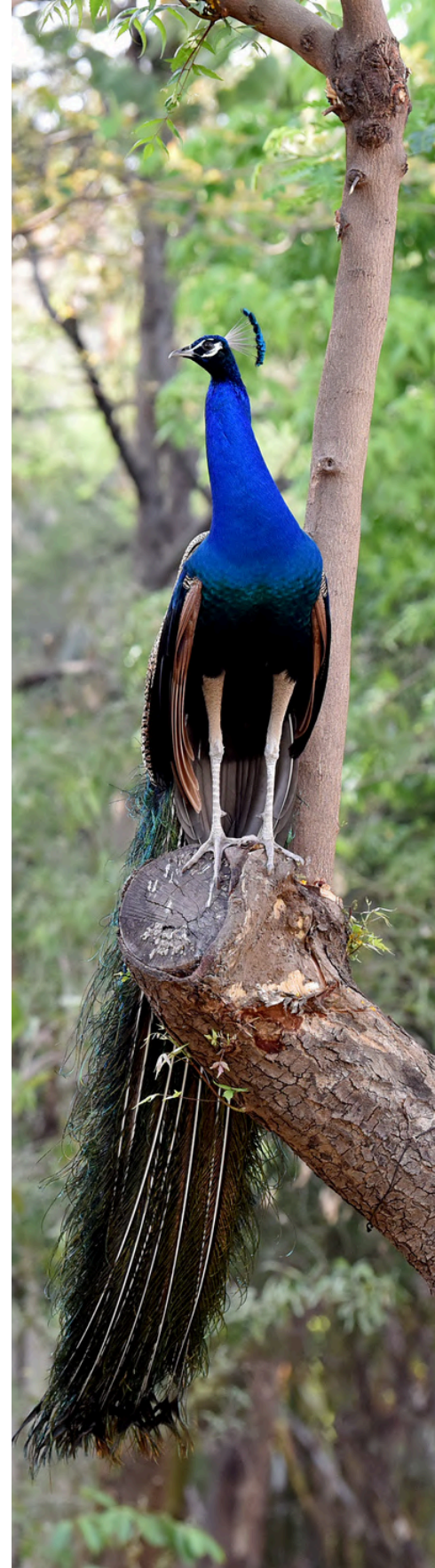
